Terrarium Home Care Basics

For non-succulent plants:

LIGHT: Bright, but indirect light is best. If placed in direct sun, the glass could contribute to burning your plants.

WATERING: Water once every one or two weeks, down to the rock layer, keeping the soil moist in-between with a spray bottle or a few drops of water. If your terrarium has a lid, water less frequently. Only water when soil begins to feel dry.

HELPFUL TIPS:

- Trimming plants back can help you keep a tidy looking terrarium if it is becoming overgrown
- Remove any dead material to prevent issues from spreading.
- Occasionally wipe down glass with a damp cloth.
- You may find you need to water more in the growing season (i.e. spring, summer months), but less in winter. This is normal.

Succulent Plants:

LIGHT: Bright, indirect light! Usually succulents do fine right in the window, but use caution because the glass can magnify the light and burn your plants. Lots of indirect light would be perfect, and keep the plants from burning.

WATERING: Mist succulents at least once a week, but do allow the soil to become dry between watering.

HELPFUL TIPS:

- Remember these plants are fairly easy to care for but, over watering can damage them.
- Remove any rotting material to keep succulents looking their best.
- Occasionally wipe down glass with damp cloth.
- You may find you need to water more in the growing season (i.e. spring, summer months), but less in winter. This is normal.
